Doris had broken her wrist and her femur up into her hip socket when she fell. Her wrist was placed in a cast, and Dr. Scott performed a hip replacement. "The staff called and talked to me on the phone on my way to the hospital. They were wonderful at keeping me informed," said Katie, Doris' daughter.

After surgery she recovered in the Medical-Surgical unit. Doris then spent six weeks in the Acute Rehab Unit

home and she had to relearn how to walk. "The nurses and physical therapists were so good, and they take their job seriously. They want you to be able to do things on your own, so they push you to do so," Doris said.

"A staff member came out to her house just to make sure things were safe," explained Katie. "They showed her how to get into bed, go to the bathroom, sit up and down, and get in and out of the shower."

Once home, Doris continued outpatient rehab for six weeks. "They always made it personal and asked about my day. They were friendly and made it fun. We practiced practical movements like how to stir food that I enjoyed cooking," Doris shared.
